

# “An entertaining romp!”

Have you ever considered the destiny of your pet? The life purpose your beloved dog or cat may have beyond simple friendship?

That’s an underlying theme in *God’s Furry Angels* and its companion, *A Year in the Lives of God’s Furry Angels*, two new novels by award-winning journalist and photographer Kirby Lee Davis. Both books look at the divine role all creatures play in this world.

“Don’t get me wrong – first and foremost, this book is an entertaining romp,” Davis said of *God’s Furry Angels*. “I wrote it to warm your heart, no matter your age or background. But along the way, I wanted to look at why such stories touch us so, and in doing that, to examine life itself, and God’s plan for us. The book’s different viewpoints encourage that.”

*God’s Furry Angels* shares the playful adventures of a wide-eyed kitten growing up in a budding American family. Crossing many genres, from the supernatural to comedy, contemporary to fantasy, this lavishly illustrated book (with photos by Davis) weaves its tales through several characters: loving newlyweds, aging veterans, a diverse band of city park animals, a patriarchal narrator. While that diversity reaches all age groups, the central viewpoint comes from Bridget, the curious, irrepressible kitten who impacts all their lives.


“Cats provide a great bridge to readers,” said Davis. “Kittens are much like people in their actions and temperament: very individual, selfish, stubborn, playful, aggressive, impulsive, opportunistic. They’re easy to identify with, and quite revealing. We see ourselves in her coming-of-age story.”

*God’s Furry Angels* opens with the death of Jessica Ferguson’s longtime cat, Sabastian, an alpha male known for aggressive, occasionally playful antics. Jessica’s husband John didn’t mind Sabastian’s passing so much, for that feline loved to tease John and other newcomers to Jessica’s life. The old cat’s death also eased a budget strained by Jessica’s pre-med school bills. But John shares his wife’s pain, and so to soothe her broken heart, he gives her a shiny porcelain figurine resembling her lost friend, with the promise of a real cat as soon as they can afford one.

That’s when strange occurrences start shaking the Ferguson household, mimicking the nuisances Sabastian was known for. These renew the anguish of Sabastian’s passing, until John finds a solution he didn’t expect and can’t refuse: the chance to bring home a real kitten at a very, very reasonable price.

Just how Bridget entered that picture, and why she was so readily available, ties other characters into this engaging saga. Through their interwoven tales, *God’s Furry Angels* offers insights on friendship and love, temptation, ambition, and compassion, along with the active role all creatures play in this life.

These tales, and many others, are revisited in the companion book. But *A Year in the Lives of God’s*



*Furry Angels* offers readers an entirely different experience, abandoning traditional narrative for an annual calendar of daily escapades by the same community of characters. This illustrated diary carries its readers through tales that take place before, during, and after those in *God’s Furry Angels*, using an easy-to-read style that greatly augments its source book, yet provides its own stand-alone value.

With their many photos and lively text, *God’s Furry Angels* and *A Year in the Lives of God’s Furry Angels* provide fun adventures for all ages. These books offer that “feel-good” experience you’ll look forward to reading time and again, whether alone or with your loved ones.

Beyond his life’s study of cats, Davis is a singer, songwriter, videographer, and game designer. His byline appeared in multiple newspapers and wire services across 41 years, along with national magazines, regional newsletters, and online newswires.
